I am writing this letter on behalf of Comprehensive Juvenile Services, CJS, in support of their programs and their continual funding by the Division of Youth Services. CJS has been a vital part of this community for forty three (43) years. During this time, CJS has offered numerous programs that have benefited not only the juveniles involved in the juvenile justice system, but their families as well.

The goal of the juvenile justice system is rehabilitation and programs such as Girls Circle, Council for Boys and Life Skills classes are vital to the rehabilitation of our juveniles. These programs provide a safe learning environment where our kids learn valuable life and social skills that help them overcome many of the obstacles they face in everyday life.

Perhaps one of the most important services CJS provides is mental health treatment for juveniles through subcontractors. These programs include anger management, substance abuse treatment, and counseling. A majority of juveniles involved in the juvenile justice system have a dire need for one or more of the mental health treatment services CJS provides; however, their ability to pay can sometimes be a great burden. By providing free services to our juveniles, and sometimes their families, these juveniles are benefited and are able to become more productive members of our society. The programs allow these juveniles to address problems they face and help them learn healthy coping mechanisms in order to prevent future contact with the juvenile justice system.

The work CJS does with juveniles who have been committed to the Division of Youth Services, DYS, is incredibly important to the juvenile, their families, and the community. Juveniles who have been committed to DYS are at a much higher risk to become adult offenders and have continuous problems into adulthood. CJS provides assessments that allow DYS to better understand the juvenile, their family, and the problems that are going to be addressed while the juvenile is in DYS. This assessment allows DYS to tailor a treatment plan to each child and provides the individual exactly what he/she may need. CJS also provides Aftercare services that assist the Juvenile Court. These aftercare workers provide regular reports on high risk juveniles that allow the Court to make educated decisions on behalf of the juvenile and ensure that juvenile is being provided with the necessary assistance he/she may need in order to succeed.

CJS works hand in hand with the Court to ensure the safety of our children within the community. This is done by afterhours supervision, electronic monitoring, and emergency shelter. Throughout my time as the Juvenile Prosecuting Attorney, there have been several situations where the Court was aware that a juvenile would be in danger if they were to be placed back in their home. When that situation arises, CJS is the first call due to their bed space at various children's shelters in the community. Without these beds, children would either be forced to go to an unsafe home or go into the care of the Department of Human Services.

Afterhours supervision and electronic monitors have been a great tool that the Court is able to utilize because of the resources provided by CJS. These resources include expensive electronic monitors and a CJS employee who makes face-to-face contact with higher risk juveniles. The resources provided by CJS often times allow the Court to limit the time a juvenile spends in the Juvenile Detention Center and allows the Juvenile Probation Office to ensure the safety of their kids by knowing where they are and deterring runaway behavior.

CJS is an invaluable resource within this community and provides so many important services that allow the Court to rehabilitate the juveniles we encounter. The Fort Smith Public Schools (FSPS) and Comprehensive Juvenile Services (CJS) partnership is one which I have personally been involved with since moving to Fort Smith in 1994. Prior to 1994 I had no professional experience working with at risk students. So beginning with my first assignment in an alternative classroom I came to be slowly introduced to the services, support, and cooperation that were available to us as educators, and more importantly the support and guidance, CJS provided to our students in Aftercare.

In the twenty four following years, and in my various district roles as counselor, Assistant Principal, Principal, Coordinator, and now Supervisor of Student Services I count on CJS as an ally which has collaboratively sought to make the lives of our students better through an education that offers 360 degrees of support.

We have open lines of communication between the CJS direct service staff and our schools. If a situation warrants, CJS administrative staff has made us keenly aware they are available for consultation, and intervention as warranted. A component of CJS's service for students is to assist with enrollment into a new school. This transition is simplified here in FSPS because the Aftercare caseworkers are aware of what academic information is needed for placement. Equally important are the recommendations they make based upon their experiences. This shared knowledge may ultimately ease a student's transition into their new school environment, which in 2020 no longer means an immediate alternative learning environment. Serving as an extra pair of eyes for CJS' Aftercare clients, CJS' workers utilize information they learn from the school to reinforce prosocial behavior and reteach behavioral missteps a student may take. This support and reteach are only possible because of communication and relationships which are fostered over time and consistency in personnel at CJS.

It is no doubt that CJS is an advocate for all youth, in whatever capacity is warranted, including advocating for the least restrictive punishment unless community safety is an issue. Their advocacy is accomplished in a professional and courteous manner at all times, a living goal they continually strive for.
