Day Programs for Individuals with Intellectual or Developmental Disabilities

PILOT OVERVIEW

Arkansas State University's HOWL (Helping Our Wolves Learn) transition program and ATLAS (Autonomy Through Leadership, Advocacy, and Service) transition program provide supports to enrolled students with ID/D and/or Autism who are seeking gainful employment in the community; the program works to increase students' independence/performance in financial, vocational, academic, and social skills to lead to community integration and employment.

DESIGN

Utilize pre-existing Inclusive Post Secondary Education (IPSE) programs at A-State as a model for developing actionable recommendations to expand and enhance Medicaid ID/D day programs for transition-age students with ID/D and/or Autism.
