

## **Urgent Care Clinics**

### **Zoom Public Hearing (12/4/24 @ 10:30 AM CST)**

**Mac Golden:** Thank you everyone and welcome to a public hearing on a rule regarding Urgent Care Clinics. Anita Castleberry, the Division of Medical Services Business Operations Manager, will be announcing the notice of rulemaking. Then we will open the floor for public comments. To make a public comment, please utilize the raise hand feature via zoom and you will be recognized to give your comment on the record. All official responses to public comment will appear on the DHS proposed rule website after the public comment period concludes. The notice of rulemaking will now be read.

**Anita Castleberry:** Good morning, notice of rulemaking. The Department of Human Services announces for a public comment period of thirty (30) calendar days (November 15 through December 14, 2025) a notice of rulemaking for the following proposed rule under one or more of the following chapters, subchapters, or sections of the Arkansas Code: §§ 25-10-129, 20-76-201, and 20-77-107. The proposed effective date of the rule is February 1, 2025.

The Director of the Division of Medical Services (DMS) amends the Arkansas Medicaid Provider Manual section 171.100 to include Urgent Care Clinics as an allowed provider type. Beneficiaries who do not have a primary care physician will be allowed a total of four Urgent Care, hospital affiliated Walk-in, or Emergent Clinic visits, or a combination thereof, before a PCP referral is required. There is no fiscal impact.

All public comments must be received by DHS no later than December 14, 2024. Please note that public comments submitted in response to this notice are considered public documents. A public comment, including the commenter's name and any personal information contained within the public comment, will be made publicly available and may be seen by various people.
